OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAMME

To prevent and control non-communicable diseases on the basis of Primary Health Care approaches, such as, cancer and palliative care, cardiovascular diseases, chronic pulmonary diseases, diabetes and other genetic diseases.

DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES

Under the general supervision and guidance of Director, Department of Noncommunicable Diseases and Environmental Health (NDE), to:

- 1. To provide guidance and support to countries on implementation of national commitments in the UN Political Declaration.
- 2. To develop guidelines, strategies and facilitate implementation of non-communicable disease-related multisectoral policies and plans in SEAR countries
- 3. To advocate for inclusion of NCDs into the national development plans and policies
- 4. To facilitate implementation of "One WHO Workplan on NCDs" including establishment of global co-ordination mechanisms and UN Interagency task force missions to countries
- 5. To co-ordinate with various technical units to monitor and report on regional flagship deliverables and indicators
- 6.To forge regional cooperation for catalyzing integration of NCDs into the development agenda including through regional bodies such as ASEAN
- 7.To participate in and report, as necessary, on various NCD resolutions and progress reports to SEAR governing bodies
- 8.To co-ordinate among various technical units and with WCOs to prepare the biennial regional status report on NCDs


